for the Transportation of Provisions, the first we can com-c.c. mand on that Service, we shall send round to Potowmack, with Orders to take what you have on that River: What lies convenient to Patuxent, had best be sent to convenient Landings there but, if you have an Opportunity, we wish you in the mean Time to hire a Vessel and send forward the Provisions, inclusive of the Pork from Potowmack, addressed to Colo Henry Hollingsworth at the Head of Elk. If we should send a Vessel round at the same Time, there would be no great Disappointment, as she may carry Fish or other Provisions from above or below you.
