We last Night received M<sup>r</sup> Waters's Resignation or rather Refusal to act as Purchaser of Provisions in Montgomery County under the late Act, and we inclose you an Appointment and send you by Cap<sup>t</sup> Griffith, two thousand Dollars to go on with. It is essential to the Service that we should be regularly furnished with a Monthly Return of your Purchase, agreeable to the Act, and we request you will specify in it the Place to which you collect the Provisions. If you should get any barrell'd Pork or Beef, you will be careful to have it examined and, if there's any Doubt of its Keeping, you must, by all Means, have it put into proper Order and, if necessary, Salt added.
