That the said Treasurer pay to Capt. Beriah Maybury one hundred and forty one Pounds Thirteen shillings & six pence due him per Acc<sup>t</sup> passed by the Dep<sup>y</sup> Aud. and also the further Sum of Fifty Pounds on Account

After three Days spent in examining Witnesses on both Sides on a Memorial presented to the Governor & Council by James Draine, Marsh Marine Duvall, Benjamin Belt, Joseph Duvall, and James Draine jun<sup>r</sup> against James Mullikin praying that he might be removed from the Magistracy of Prince Georges County, It was recommended by his Excellency & the Council to the Parties, to make up and settle all Differences subsisting between them and in future to live in Peace. Whereupon the Memorialists agree to withdraw their Memorial and We the Subscribers agree that all Differences & Disputes which have heretofore subsisted between Us be buried in Oblivion and that we will not revive the same and that this shall be published in the News Paper

That the Commissary of Stores deliver to Lieut, Baquess of Capt. Campbells Comp<sup>y</sup> two pair of Shoes.
