Annapolis the 10<sup>th</sup> April 1779

Gentlemen

I Came down to have the honour of presenting my Compliments to you ; in the mean time call for your assistance in my recruiting. Congress having ordered my Legion to Georgia authorised me to the same right of inlisting Soldiers, for undouptely or by sickness or desertion I'll lose some of my men on the road, which lost added to the one I made in the last Campaign could hardly be repaired in the southward the white people being very scarce there. that granted I should be very much indepted to you, would the Cap<sup>t</sup> Segond who I leave behind, find the same protection and support which the Council granted to him last year.

I clame Gentelman for your steem and amity. calling my legion, Maryland legion I'll endeavour my self to have that name for ever honoured by our friends and respected by our enemies, and that way reach to the glory whom I and my officers are found off
