We hear a Boat has gone up from Hampton she was spoke by Capt Rogers but he could not hear distinctly; we suppose she carries you later Intelligence than we have received. By Major Smith's Return 6th March he had at the Fort 14 spare Musquets & 13 spare Bayonets, a small Number, but worth looking out.
