That the said Treasurer pay to Charles Wallace Esq^r Paymaster one thousand Pounds on Account.

That the said Treasurer pay to John Muir three thousand nine hundred and fifty nine Pounds, five shillings & three pence for the use of Wilkins & Muir per Accounts passed by the Aud. Gen^l
