Robert Wood for John Cypher a 9 M<sup>o</sup> Soldier in the 7 Regim<sup>t</sup> and also for John Campbell a 9 M<sup>o</sup> Sold<sup>r</sup> in the same Reg<sup>t</sup> Twenty nine Pounds ten shillings in Cloathing for each due them per Act of Assembly to procure Troops for the A Army

That the western shore Treasurer pay to Richard Liden Thirty seven Pounds ten shillings due him per Acc<sup>t</sup> passed by the Dep<sup>y</sup> And.

That the said Treasurer pay to Archibald Job six hundred Pounds for the use of & to be delivered over to Richard Bond of Cecil County p Acc<sup>t</sup> passed by the Aud. G<sup>l</sup>

We are very desirous of setling with our Matrosses in such Manner as to give no Uneasiness. We understood the Money which was advanced them before they sailed, was in Part of their monthly Pay and not as a Bounty. We shall be glad to be informed, by the earliest Opportunity, what you did pay them exactly and for what Purposes, and whether it was inclusive or exclusive of what they were entitled to as Matrosses, as well as the Satisfaction made the Officer who went with them.
