Some Time ago M<sup>r</sup> Yeiser called on the State for the £90. rec<sup>d</sup> by M<sup>r</sup> Judah 24<sup>th</sup> June, perhaps other Claims may also remain unsatisfied. We request you'll make Enquiry and if the Money is not paid, inform the People that M<sup>r</sup> Judah has rec<sup>d</sup> the Money and that they are to look to him for it. You will also be pleased to acquaint M<sup>r</sup> Judah that it is necessary he should settle his Account yet standing against him and that he can resign his Commission only to us.
