Sir.

Your Excellency's Letter was delivered to me in the Absence of the Governor and Council. In Answer to which, I am to observe, that no particular Provision has been made by our Assembly for recruiting the German Battalion, further than a general Licence to raise Men in the different Parts of this State. The Inconveniencies that had been experienced by inlisting the Inhabitants to serve in the Regiments of other States induced the Legislature, some Time since to prohibit the Practice under a heavy Penalty. The Resolve of Congress has occasioned a partial Repeal of this Prohibition, and accordingly the following Clause was inserted the last Session of Assembly in the Act to procure Troops for the American Army, by Virtue of which, Levies for this Battalion are now excepted. And be it enacted that it shall and may be lawful for the Officers or recruiting Sergeants of the German Battalion
