Vanbibber undertook to get us a Cap^t; we left it with him, as his Anxiety to get something into your Hands, we knew, would prompt his Exertions; we inclose you a Copy of his Letter, which shews his good Opinion of Deshon and the Contract he made with him. The Gen^t Smallwood, we expect, will sail with Tobacco & Flower about the same Time as the Molly. The Difficulty and great Expence of procuring Cargoes at the Inlets makes it desirable these Vessels should come into the Bay, and we have Expectations if, as probable, there should be a French War the
