We are also of opinion that your Ex^{cy} may dismiss or suspend any person from practiceing the Law within this province upon Just and sufficient cause shewn to your Ex^{cy} The process proper ag^t the said Judges is a venire facias unless your Ex^{cy} will be pleased to call them before yourselfe and the hon^{ble} his Mat^{ys} privy Councill.

All which we do humbly Submitt to your Excy
