Ordered that the Peticon giving good Security for Answering the Vallue of the Goods seized (if he don't produce his Letters of Naturalizacon or Denization or Some Authentick proofe for the Same, within a year and a day from the date hereof) unto George Plater Esq his ma<sup>15</sup> Receiver for the Use of his Ma<sup>15</sup> & that then the prayer of the Peticon be granted.

Mr John Chiles the Bearer hereof being sent Ordr to Mr by his Exncy Sr Edmd Andros his Mats Lieutent a horse and Govr Genli of Virga on an Express to New York for his Mats imedeiate Service, It is hereby directed and Ordered that Mr Jacob Vangazeloe do upon his Arrivall in Coecill County take Care to provide him with a horse as farr as New Castle in Ordr to his Dispatch.

## June the 10th 1697.

The Councill again Sate and were prent as before.

Lre from the Govr of Virga abt 2 Men of War & 7 other Ships Arrived there . . . other Ships from England.

Produced and Read a Letter by Express sent from his Exney Sr Edmund Andros his mats Govern of Virga Dated the 4th of June Instant Signifying the Arrivall of two of his mats ffrigotts and Seaven p. 513 from England.

Lords of the Councill for Trade &c: Lre abt severalls Read.

Read also a letter by his Ex<sup>ncy</sup> Recd: from the R<sup>t</sup> hon<sup>rble</sup> the Lords of the Councill for Trade &<sup>ca</sup> dated the 4<sup>th</sup> of ffeb<sup>ry</sup> last past relating to Severalls.

Lords of the Councils Lre abt Capt Every & pyrats Read together with a printed Proclamation; Read afterwards a Letter recd: from the R<sup>t</sup> hon<sup>rble</sup> the Lords of his Ma<sup>ts</sup> most hon<sup>rble</sup> Privy Councill dated the 27<sup>th</sup> of August past together with a Printed Proclamacon about one Cap<sup>t</sup> Every alias Bridgman and his Seamen &<sup>ca</sup>
