ises.

Ordered that the Hon^{rble} Coll: John Courts and Maj^r W^m Dent be Writt to, to know why they sent not his Ex^{ncy} an Acco^t of the News about the Arrivall of those Men of Warr in Virg^a hearing they had Notice of it and Reported it about. P. 545 His Ex^{ncy} being pleased to say that if they Could not think fit to let him know such news as well as others, his Ex^{ncy} does not think fitt that they should Report such things about, not knowing what Damage and Prejudice it might be to his Ma^{ts} Intrest the Noising Such things about.

Ordered that Mr Collyer and Mr Aldern Navl Officr and Depty Coll of the Port of Williamstadt be writt to, to give an Accot why they sent not his Exrey word, of the News William

Sharpe brought from Virginia.
