All w^{ch} charge is to be paid out of the Condemnation & forfeiture of all or any of the Goods imported in the said Boat & Sloop & and if anything remains after such charge deducted; the same is to be appropriated to the use the Act of the Assembly directs.

The Honoble Thomas Tench Esq^r and Major Will^m Dent persons appointed to go to his Ex^{ncy} S^r Edmund Andros in Virginia upon the Indian affair humbly move for an Order upon the Treasurer to advance them some money to defray the expence of their Negotiation, whereupon it is Ordered by this Board that M^r Robert Mason Treasurer for the Western Shore do advance them the Sum of thirty pounds Sterll towards the defraying the said expence.
