A Iournall of a Iourney from Nanjemy in Charles County Maryland to Iames Town in Virginia by Thoms Tench Esq<sup>t</sup> and William Dent being sent by his Exney the Govern & Councill of Maryland to his Exney Sr Edmund Andros Govern of Virginia on express about the Indians &ca 1697. Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> of Novem 1697.

About eight in the Morning we sett out from Will<sup>m</sup> Dents at Nanjemy and got our horses over Potomock & travelled to Whitings fferry on Rappahannock in Virginia & there lodged

that night.

Wednesday 3<sup>d</sup> Novem<sup>r</sup> We passed Rappahannock fferry at Whitings and so to Yarboroughs fferry on the ffreshes

Pomunkey River & there lodged that night.

Thursday 4th We passed Pomunkey fferry and that Evening came to Iames Towne, calling at Collo Ludwells as we went, and because we understood that the Assembly was ended we sent Perry to his Exncy Sr Edmunds house to give our service and an accor of our arrival desiring to know when we might wait on his Exncy And Perry meeting us again & acquainting us that his Exney was at home & ready to receive us, we immediately took horses and went to his house, delivered his Letter from his Exncy the Govern of Maryland wch when read his Exncy Sr Edmund Andros desired to know what we had to Offer whereupon we perused our Instructions & gave his Exncy a Verball account of what we had given us in charge to weh his Exney reply'd that in reguard it consisted of divers heads to which divers answers might be requisite; he desired if we thought fit that what we had to Say might be laid before him in Writing to prevent all mistakes, of weh we desired time to consider, weh was granted and after some time we took leave & returned to one Rawlins in Iames Towne our Lodgings, and we heard that that night his Exncy Sent to Coll Iennings to some of the Councill that were there, who the same day went from thence to Stopp them there till further Orders.

Fryday 5th of Novem' We went again to his Exneys house,
