

Lib. H. D. Thursday 11<sup>th</sup> of Novem<sup>r</sup> We sent for our horses, went to wait on the Council but mett them coming to us The Deputy Sec<sup>ry</sup> Coll<sup>o</sup> Ienings delivered us two papers as the Councils result upon our matters.

We asked if we were to have any further answer; It was return'd there was no further answer. Afterwards in the Hall we asked his Ex<sup>ncy</sup> & Council present if we were to expect any further answer. His Ex<sup>ncy</sup> answered that the matter required no further answer then what was given; but there was a Letter from his Ex<sup>ncy</sup> the Govern<sup>r</sup> of Maryland which would be answered hereafter. So we took leave and went that night to Coll<sup>o</sup> Ludwells and lodged there. The Govern<sup>r</sup> & Councils Result is annexed.

ffryday 12<sup>th</sup> Novem<sup>r</sup> Went from Coll<sup>o</sup> Ludwells passed Spencers fferry at the ffreshes of Pomunkey River and lodged Seaven miles beyond at the house of one Carr.

Saturday 13<sup>th</sup> Novem<sup>r</sup> We passed Mattapany River fferry at Tarborough and so down to Southins fferry kept by one Catlet, went over there & so to Cap<sup>t</sup> Arthur Spicers two Miles off and lodged there that night.

Sunday 14<sup>th</sup> Novem<sup>r</sup> We came from Cap<sup>t</sup> Arthur Spicers and so to Cap<sup>t</sup> John Withers on Potomock River and lodged there that night.

Munday 15<sup>th</sup> Novem<sup>r</sup> We came over Potomock in Cap<sup>t</sup> Thomas Bakers small boat to his Shipp Riding at Nanjemy Road, and from thence he set us up in his boat to Lewis Neck, and so we came over Nanjemy Creek to William Dents; and Cap<sup>t</sup> Withers with his fflatt set our horses over Potomock to p. 600 Cœdar point, and the Men ridd them round the same day So that night we all arrived safe at Will<sup>m</sup> Dents Nanjemy Charles County Maryland. And so ended this Iourney on Munday night the 15<sup>th</sup> day of Novem<sup>br</sup> 1697.

Tuesday 16<sup>th</sup> day of Novem<sup>r</sup> We transcribed our Iournall & writt to his Ex<sup>ncy</sup> the Govern<sup>r</sup> of Maryland an Acco<sup>t</sup> of what we had more to say or had observed concerning the præmises &<sup>ca</sup>
