Æquinoctial line or Æquator, as well in the Ocean and Medi-Lib. H. D. terranean Sea, as elsewhere; And lastly, after the tenth of March next ensuing beyond the said Line throughout the whole World without any exception or distinction of time or place, and without any form of Process, shall immediately, without damage, be restored to the Owner, according to the said treaty. And hereof all his Majesties Subjects are hereby Required to take notice, and to conform themselves thereunto accordingly.

That Whereas by an Act of Parliament made in the seaventh & eighth years of our Reigne Intituled an act for preventing frauds and regulating abuses in the Plantation trade It is amongst other things therein enacted That all the present Governours & Comanders in chief of any English Collonies and Plantations shall before the five and twentieth day of March 1697, And all who shall be made Governours or Comanders in chief of the said Collonies or Plantacons or any of them before the entring into their Governments shall take a Sollemne Oath to doe their utmost that all the clauses matters & things conteined in one act of Parliament made in the twelfth year of the reigne of the late King Charles the second.
