D. make Proclamation hereof in all Churches, Chappels & at all Musters, trainings & other publick places of meeting within their respective Counties, whereunto all persons concern'd are to yield due and ready obedience, as they and every of them will answer the contrary at their perill; Given at the Town & Port of Annapolis under the Broad Seale of the Province this 3<sup>d</sup> day of December in the ninth year of the Reign of our Soveraign Lord King William the third & Annoq Dom 1697.

God save the King.

Ordered that notice be forthwith given by the Sherriffs to the field Officers of each respective County that they omitt not with all expedition possible to raise the severall men directed and Ordered to be raised in October last, and in getting the Publick Arms well fitted and fixt. No further business offering the Councill broke up for this time.

At a Councill held at the Port of Annapolis the 3<sup>d</sup> day of Decem<sup>r</sup> 1696. in the ninth year of his Majesties Reign.
