Major Walter Smith, Cap<sup>t</sup> Will<sup>m</sup> Parker, M<sup>r</sup> Francis Hutchins and M<sup>r</sup> Sam<sup>l</sup> Houldsworth, ffour of the Iustices of Calvert County came and humbly moved his Ex<sup>ncy</sup> in Councill, that whereas they had been lately summoned to appear before his Ex<sup>ncy</sup> in Councill the last Tuesday of ffeb<sup>ry</sup> next to answer a certain contempt to an Order of Councill for dismissing M<sup>r</sup> James Crauford Attorney at Law from pleading in any of the Courts of the Province, w<sup>ch</sup> they humbly desire may be forgiven them, pleading ignorance in what they did Ordered that the said return be delivered to Major Smith, that if the said Commissioners will give anything under their hands as an acknowledg<sup>mt</sup> of their Error, he will upon this news of a peace, remit their offence whereupon the paper was delivered to the said Major Smith at the Board, he giving a Receipt for the same.

A Dispute arising betwixt the Hono<sup>ble</sup> Edw<sup>d</sup> Randolph Esq<sup>r</sup> Surveyor Gen<sup>l</sup> of his Maj<sup>tes</sup> Customes on the Continent of America &<sup>ca</sup> And Peter Ienings Esq<sup>r</sup> Collect<sup>r</sup> of his Maj<sup>tes</sup> Customes in Patuxent District, as to the limitts of the s<sup>d</sup> district and appointing Deputies &<sup>ca</sup>

It is Ordered th<sup>t</sup> the said Esq<sup>r</sup> Randolph Revoke his Com<sup>missions</sup> of Collect<sup>r</sup> granted to M<sup>r</sup> Collyer & M<sup>r</sup> Bladen for the Ports of Annapolis nnd Williamstadt, and that he give them Com<sup>missions</sup> for being Survey<sup>rs</sup> of those places; but th<sup>t</sup> the said M<sup>r</sup> Ienings continue his Deputies at those Ports as formerly, and that M<sup>r</sup> Collyer be continued Navall Officer of the Port of Williamstadt afores<sup>d</sup>, but that his former Commission, wherein he is constituted Riding Survey<sup>r</sup> be vacated as before Ordered, and that a new Commission be granted him for being Navall Officer of that Port.

His Ex<sup>ncy</sup> is pleased to signify that he had shew'd to Esq<sup>r</sup> Randolph all the Lists of Shipping since his being concern'd in the Government as also what he brought out of Virginia, and th<sup>t</sup> he likewise gave him the Perusal of the two Lists rec<sup>d</sup> from the R<sup>ty</sup> Hono<sup>ble</sup> the Comiss<sup>rs</sup> of his Maj<sup>tes</sup> Customs, one of the Shipps giving Bond in England to go to Virginia & Maryland to return to England Wales or Berwick only, in the years 90: 91: 92: 93. and a list of certificates to discharge Bonds for Shipps th<sup>t</sup> gave Bond in the Plantation to come to England Wales or Berwick only.

It is demanded of the Board if they knew of anything else for his Maj<sup>tes</sup> service to be offered at this time; who having nothing further to offer they broke up.
