It was required if they had anything to offer or Communicate to the Governm<sup>t</sup> to w<sup>ch</sup> they Answered they had nothing farther then to desire that League of friendship Contracted between us might remaine Inviolable and that they all ways took us for their friends and that they will be so to us, That they mett us now not for any Complaint they had to make of any Injury sustained by the English but onely to heare by the great man of the Susquehanahs who has lately been taken Prisoner by the Naked Indians & redelivered what it was he had upon that & his Own Nation acc<sup>t</sup> to offer being so desired by them

On the 26<sup>th</sup> of May Instant The Treaty with the Dellawares being Compleated & we the p<sup>r</sup>sons Appointed by this Governm<sup>t</sup> for Managem<sup>t</sup> thereof departing homeward In the Interim Came Connetectah King of the Susquehanaes together with two more of his great men & one Lewee Lewison a frenchman resident among them who gave an acc<sup>t</sup> th<sup>t</sup> the Shavanole King with his great men were on their march but by reason of his great Age Could not Come so farr as they but would be with us that night he the s<sup>d</sup> Conetectah Desiring the Presence of the Dellaware King and his great men to hear on the Morrow what he had to Offer to the English & Indians in Amity with us from Lowensah King of the Shawkelawgues als Naked Indians and accordingly in the Evening Came Meaurroway King of the Shawanoles brought on horseback by reason of his Age together with one of his great men and one Martine Shartee a french man resident & married Among them but being late in the Evening and Understanding they had much to Offer on that Subject we resolved to deferr the business till the next Morning being so requested by the Indians who were Somewhat discomposed by reason of their Long hard travell Accordingly on the morrow wee the persons appointed haveing given Notice by Cap<sup>t</sup> Hanse Steetman Interp<sup>r</sup>ter in Chiefe for the Northern Parts of this Province Orders to Acquaint the Indians that we would proceed and haveing given them what Methods we took for the Managem<sup>t</sup> thereof accordingly We tooke our Place where
