

Nations this being the Substance of w^t he had to Offer on behalfe of the Shawkerawques he then acquainted us that it was the King of the Susquehannahs Resolution not to agitate any thing on the behalfe of himselfe or Nation without the Consent of this Governm^t desireing their Result in the matter so soon as possible with Convenience & th^t they might receive their Answer at the house of Cap^t Hanse w^{ch} Resolution was approved & Confirmed by the Other Nations Unanimously resolveing to Act & do no further then what this Governm^t will Consent Unto in gen^l desireing the Amity & Peace between th^m & this Province may stand firm & good as formerly whereupon they shook hands with us in token of the Sincerity of their Affections so we drank our Kings health & his Ex^{cys} & shook hands with th^m & p^{ted} friendly.

Inclosed is an acc^t of our Proceedings with the Indians att the head of the bay w^{ch} we could not possibly sooner p^rforme by reason of the Indians were not come in I give your Ex^{cy} further Acc^t that the Susquehannah King was by the Naked Indians last August taken Prisoner & was by sixty of the same Indians brought within one days Journey to his own Town with great Hon^r home againe inclosed likewise is an acc^t of Some News from the Northern Parts w^{ch} lately The Lyceners of New York is very much Countenansd by the new Gov^r & tis Reported th^t Coll: fletcher goes home a Prisoner I have not further to Offer but th^t I am
