Appeared before this Board Captain Francis Harbin, Mr Gilbert Clark Thomas Dillion Edwd Fields Iohn Shanks Mr Joshua Guibert Mr Iohn Baptista Carbeny & Kenelm Cheseldyn Esqr & this Board understanding that the said Persons were knowing and had heard of several indirect & evil Actions practices & discourses used & done by Gerrard Slye Iohn Cood Senr Robert Mason & Philip Clark of St Marys County Gent did Order the said Persons to write down their several Depositions wherein they were to set forth the Truth the whole truth & nothing but the Truth what they themselves knew or had heard Concerning the sd Mr Sly Mr Cood Mr Mason & Mr Clark in relation to this his Majestys Government or his Excellency the Governor thereof
