Present that it will be most to his Mats Service, and benefit of the merchants and Ownrs &ca That the sd Ships be left to their own liberty to Sayle more especially Considering they are but few & Ships of no great Countenance and as to the Questions put about the Reasons of their Stay, they all make answer that they can blame none but themselves and doe believe that their Stay has proceeded from Nothing but want of getting their Tobo on Board.

Ships left behind Order'd to be clear'd as got ready that the Collrs and Nav¹¹ Officers take Notice thereof and Conform themselves accordingly.
