laid upon tobo: Exported as being the least burthensome Original to the poore and neecessitous people of the province and Journal. scarcely peptable to those who are capable of Shipping tob: whereby the publick Charge of the province will be the Easier defrayed.

Which being read it is putt to the question wheither the 3<sup>d</sup> p hh<sup>d</sup> addiconall Duty be raised for defraying the publick charge or not.

Carryed by majority of votes that an ad<sup>11</sup> duty of 3<sup>d</sup> p hh<sup>d</sup> may be advanced towards paym<sup>t</sup> of the public charge of the province.

And ordered that the Comittee of Laws prepare a bill for

that purpose.

And ordered that an answer to the aforesd, Message be drawne up and sent to his Ex<sup>cy</sup> and Councill for that purpose. The house adjournes till 2 a Clock in the Afternoone.

Post Merediem. The house mett againe and were called over. prent as in the morning only Mr Ino Lowe sick.

The peticon of Maj<sup>r</sup> W<sup>m</sup> Barton Sher: of Prince Georges Co<sup>ty</sup> for an allowance for imprisonm<sup>t</sup> fees for a serv<sup>t</sup> boy in his Custody read and ordered Maj<sup>r</sup> Barton be called into the house. Who appeared and is Desired to Explaine his peticon which was received and is ordered to withdraw, and the peticon was againe read and Debated.

It is the opinion of this house that the Sher: be Satisfied for his imprison fees from the time that the said Serv boy

was comitted untill his Mast disclaimed him.

But put to the question whether Prince Georges Coty shall pay the fees or the burthen thereof be bourne by the publick. Carried by the Majority of voices that Prince Georges County ought to make sattisfaction for the said imprisonment fees.

And it is resolved by the house that Prince Georges County pay the said fees to the Sherriff from the time he was legally comitted to his Custody till the mat of the said Boy disclaimed

him.
