And the said M<sup>r</sup> Young is desired to make a returne of Original what Insolvent mulkts he shall find in the aforegoing arrears Journal to the next sessions of Assembly soe that this house may

further doe therein as shalbe thought Convenient.

Mr Richd Beard being called in, he appeares and being demanded whether he would hold to his agreement for building the powder roome according to the former proposalls made by his Excy and Councill and to raise the roome 2 foot from the ground on Good blocks or posts, he readyly concurrs therewith soe that the further consideracon thereof be referred to the next Sessions of Assembly. It is assented to.

The petition of Mrs Mary Vansweareingen for an allowance for arrears of ordinary expenses due to her from the publick

was here read and rejected.

Bill for impost of 3<sup>d</sup> p hh<sup>d</sup> &c. againe read with the Amendment. And Resolved by the house that it continue but two yeares and to the end of the next Sessions of Assembly after the sayd two yeares.

Which was sent up to his Ex<sup>cy</sup> and Councill by Maj<sup>r</sup> W<sup>m</sup> Dent and Coll<sup>o</sup> Tho<sup>s</sup> Ennalls. They returne and say they

delivered the same.

The house adjournes till two a Clock in the afternoone.

Post Merediem the house mett againe and being called

over, were all present as in the morning.

Thos Brooke Esq<sup>r</sup> and Coll: John Hamond enter the house and Deliver M<sup>r</sup> Speaker the Bill for add<sup>11</sup> duty of 3<sup>d</sup> p hh<sup>d</sup>. Assented to by his Ex<sup>cy</sup> and Councill and ordered to be engrossed.

The peticon of Edw Laddemore recomended this house from his Excy and Councill together with a Bill for Divorcem

therewith sent was in this house read.

And having considered the same that forasmuch as the prayer of the petitioner is of soe high a nature that this house doe not think fitt to pass the bill this Sessions. But have resolved that if the pet will appeare here the next Sessions of Assembly and bring with him such witnesses or other evidences sufficient to prove the Elopem &c then this house will take it into further consideracon.

And ordered that the pet give notice to Elizabeth the wife in the peticon mentioned that she likewise then appeare here

to make her defence if to her it shall seem meete.
