We do recomēd the same to the house for their Considera<sup>con</sup> and Encouragem<sup>t</sup>, And that for the Promotion thereof Ann Ordinance pass that after p. 32 the 10<sup>th</sup> Day of Sep<sup>t</sup> next, no other be made use of but such as are by him printed save only special Writts wherein are various recitals &c. And that all Bayle Bonds Letters testa<sup>ry</sup> Letters of Admicōn &c Citations Sumōns &c be printed and none other made use of they being allways to be had Viz the Writts Citations and Sumōns at one penny or one pound of Tob<sup>o</sup> p piece and the L<sup>res</sup> Testa<sup>ry</sup> Adracōn Bayle Bonds &c at 2<sup>d</sup> or 2 lb Tob<sup>o</sup> a piece
