Came Major Dent M^r Hutchinson & M^r Young from the House of Delegates who present M^r Richard Tilghman a Delegate of Talbot County who took the oaths appointed by Act of Parliament instead of the oaths of Allegiance & Supremacy to her Majesty & Subscribed the Test

M^r John Hall and M^r John Wight from the House present M^r John Lecompte a Burghess for Dorsett County who took the Oaths of Allegiance &c to her Majesty and Subscribed the Test

Read the right honourable the Lords of the Council of Trade & Plantations Letter of the 16th March 1701/2 with a reference from the right honourable the Lords of his Majesty's most honourable Privy Council to the said Lords of Trade &c to Enquire whether the Court of Admiralty in this Province is held by virtue of the Lords of the Admiralty's Commission or by virtue of a particular Clause in the Commission under the great Seale

In answer whereto his Excellency and this Board do say the said Courts of Admiralty for five years last past have been held by Virtue of a Commission from the right honourable the Lords of the Admiralty. The s^d Commission in a more particular manner respecting & settling that Court & the Judicature thereof.

This Board adjourned 'till 8 of the Clock to morrow morning
