The pet<sup>n</sup> of George Valentine praying the office of mace bearer to Serue in the Roome of Dan<sup>1</sup> Canum dec<sup>d</sup> was here read, and was granted by the house Nemine contradicente, and he being called into the house, m<sup>r</sup> Speaker was pleased to p. <sup>23</sup> remind him of the duty in the office of Gatekeep<sup>r</sup> that he take particular care of the Fencing about the Towne and to secure the Publick Pasture from Hogs and Cattle &c.

Brought into the House the case of Sir Thomas Laurence Secry of Maryland which followeth.

## Annapolis Aprill the 25th 1704

The present case of her Majestyes secry of Maryland humbly presented to his Excy Collonell John Seymour her Majestyes Captaine Gen<sup>11</sup> and commander in chiefe of the s<sup>d</sup> Province And humbly Sheweth

That the profitts, ariseing from the Licences, granted by the justices of every respective County in the Province to all Keepers of Ordinaryes, in this Province yearely hath from the beginning and Settleing of this Governem<sup>t</sup>, under the R<sup>t</sup> honble the Lord Baltemore been given and invested in the Secretary as a considerable Branch of his office, and alwayes

confirmed to him by act of Assembly in Maryland

That upon his late Majesty King William the third of glorious memory, his Assumeing this Government, into his owne hands, and under his imediate care, in the yeare 1692 Collonell Lyonell Copley first Governour of this Province obtained of the Assembly in that yeare to Settle the benefitts accrewing from the said Ordinary Licences on himselfe in the same manner, they had alwayes been paid to the Secry heretofore
