

P. R. O. Mr Philemon Loyd, Mr Rich<sup>d</sup> Tilghman & Mr John Salter are appointed by the house a committee of Laws

Collonell Thomas Smith, Mr Robert Bradly & m<sup>r</sup> John Smith are appointed a Committee for inspecting regulateing and stating the publick accounts of this Province

Mr William Harris, Mr Phill Lynes, and Maj<sup>r</sup> Charles Greenberry, appointed a committee of aggrievances

The pet<sup>n</sup> of Catherine Alderne, on behalfe of her daughter Susannah Blangy was here read, & the house gaue leauē that a bill be brought into the next Sessions of Assembly, and that Summons be sent to the heirs of Alderne to appeare the next Assembly to make their clayme if any

The house adjournes till 2 a clock in the afternoone

#### Post Meridiem

The house mett, were called over, and p<sup>r</sup>sent as in the morning (onely m<sup>r</sup> Thomas Beall Sick)

Bill impowering Millburnes Ex<sup>ts</sup> to sell land for payment of his Debts.

Read the 2<sup>d</sup> tyme, and doe pass

Ordered the Severall Committees goe out upon their business

Motion being made to the house that some measures be taken for conversion of the indians in the Province is referred to be considered, and resolved on tomorrow morning

p. 27 Moved by a member that measures may be taken to Suppress Popish Priests, and others from Endeavouring p<sup>r</sup>verting her Matys Subjects, and Draweing them over to the church of Rome

Message by the honble Robert Smith and James Saunders Esq<sup>rs</sup>, and alsoe a bill for settleing a Revenue of 3<sup>d</sup> p<sup>r</sup> hhd

Proposed that care be taken to obliedge the inhabitants of this Province, and their families on the Sabbath dayes either to goe to some publick place of Devotion, or to Stay att home Employing themselues in reading good bookes &c.

Moved that an Explanatory Law be made for the use of Tob<sup>o</sup> raised or to be raised, in the Sev<sup>ll</sup> parishes, where there is no Minister inducted

All w<sup>ch</sup> is referred to be considered of in the morneing

Ordered that M<sup>r</sup> W<sup>m</sup> Parker goe, and acquaint M<sup>r</sup> Henry Lowe, that the house commands his imēdiate attendance

M<sup>r</sup> Parker enters the house, and sayes he has been w<sup>th</sup> the said Low whoe refused to giue his attendance

Therefore ordered the Serjeant attendant goe imēdiatey and bring the said Henry Lowe before this house to answer his contempt
