able gratuity by a reasonable yearly allowance to be made  
unto him for such his service, as you will see other plantations  
and Collonyes, are directed by his Pattent, the Publick accounts  
of this Province being now under his care, by the Governm<sup>t</sup>  
being taken into his Ma<sup>ty</sup>s more immediate princely care &

He returnes and sayes the Council are willing to joyne in conference for that purpose & will appoint some gent to joyne with some members of this house, & ordered they mett in the Library Chamber

M<sup>r</sup> Phil Loyd and M<sup>r</sup> Rich<sup>d</sup> Tilghman appointed & ordered to attend, whoe enters the house, and reporte that the Council did resolve th<sup>t</sup> the Laws be Enacted in the Queens name according to message on that subject

The message by James Saunders and W<sup>m</sup> Coursey Esq<sup>rs</sup> being read its considered by the house that the office of W<sup>m</sup> Blathwaite Esquire does not concerne the publick of this Province, and this house doubt not but his Majesty whoe has appointed the office, has allowed a Suitable Sallary, therefore

The house proceed to resolve proposalls yesterday as followes

1. As to the proposall for conversion of Indians, Its resolved th<sup>t</sup> a bill be prepared, and brought before the house for that purpose

2. To suppress Popish Priests & others from pverting her Mat<sup>ties</sup> Subjects and draweing them over to the church of Rome, & the proposalls for the inhabitants to goe to church or some publick place of Devotion on Sundays or keep home reading good books, &c. for good Example read, and,

Resolved th<sup>t</sup> bills be drawne & brought in for the same

3. as to the Explanatory bill for to appropriate such Tob<sup>o</sup> as shall be raised in parishes where noe ministers are inducted

Likewise resolved a bill be prepared for that purpose
