And it was Proposed by a Member of this house that considering that his Ex<sup>cy</sup> had lately made a peace with the Indians whether it were not now reasonable at this very Juncture upon this p<sup>s</sup>ent renewing the peace instantly to withdraw the rangers intirely to lett the Indians have all Assurance that may be that wee designe firmly to observe our promises and Expect the same from them and give them noe occasion of diffidence to leave the forte to the Indian's owne disposing to doe them all right that they can require by letting them quietly enjoy their lands to secure the friendship of the Susquehannah and Easterne shoare Indians and to renew Effectively an Order for laying out the Choptanck Indians Lands or to go on with the Bill or adhere to the proposalls And carried by the majority of votes against the bill. And that this Vote of the house be made knowne to his Ex<sup>cy</sup> in answer to the message from
