May 9<sup>th</sup> 1700

Orderd that if Major Dorsey at or before the next Prov<sup>l</sup>  
 Court shall convey and make over to his Sonn  
 Dorsey a reall Estate equivalent to the lott and houses which fo. 59  
 his said Sonn hath at Annapolis formerly in the occupation of  
 James Cullen at his proper Cost and charge sufficiently new  
 Cover and repaire the said Houses and at the same Court  
 convey the said houses and Lott to his Maj<sup>ty</sup> for a Publick  
 Store or Magazine then his fine of Two hundred pounds shall  
 not be leavyed and the Attorney Gen<sup>l</sup> is hereby ordered to  
 see such Conveyance drawn and dispatcht according to Law  
 for which he shalbe satisfied by the Publick. Otherwise the  
 said fine to be Leavy<sup>d</sup>
