

4th That Church Officers be obliged to subscribe their Assent & Consent of the Common Prayer & 39 Articles Lib. X.

5^{thly} That no unbaptized persons may be admitted into any Office of trust in the Gov^t

6th That the Dissenters especially the Quakers do not conform to the act of Tolleration as confirmed by the Act of Religion in divers particulars first in not subscribing such declaration & Possession as provided is by that Law they should Secondly in not Registering their meeting Houses in the Several County Courts P. 333

7 That your Honours would be pleased further to recommend to the honble house of Delegates the passing of an additional Act concerning religion wherein some penalty may be inflicted on such as professing themselves protestants never attend the publick worship of God

8 That the Quakers & Papists be restrained from seducing her Majestys Protestant Subjects
