O. perticulerly in its protecting of us in the peaceable Enjoyment of our conscientious Liberty, in relation to the Worshipp of Allmighty God and also in the full and free Enjoyment of the Laws and Libertys of English Subjects. And Wee do humbly take Liberty to Declare that that person (Clark) named in the Said Written paper, and now an outlaw in Rebellion against the Government, Wee believe is a wicked and ungodly man and all his actions which have been and are continued to be Villainous abusive and Rebellious against the peaceable Government of this province. And all his Confederates, ayders, assisters, and Abetters therein Wee do in our hearts denye, disowne, detest, and abominate And it is altogether repugnant to thought, intent, and purpose of our hearts, to concerne ourselves either upon his or his Wifes account anyway, but truly and heartily desire that he and all his confederates in wickedness and Rebellion may be brought to Iustice, And this Wee have [set] forth in true Sencerity for the clearing of the Truth of God which Wee profess from Scandalls, and all Scandalous and rebellious persons and practices.
