Mrs Hemsley appearing at the Board, was shewn the aforesaid Letter, & owned it was the Same she had Subscribed, and delivered to the Clerk of the Council, on the 27th of January 1715

And further saith that M' Hunter, borrowed her book being the Practice of Physick, often being sick, and about nine Months agoe she being Sick, sent it her home, in which she found the Letter, Her Husband would have had it, but she layd it by, wound some Ribband over it Saying if the Roman Catholicks, who are People who have done her some Prejudices, had any ill designes, she thought they were frus-And says she has been Assaulted upon the Road,

and gone in fear of her life, after Govn' Seymour died, by People that cou'd have no prejudice, to her.

Mr James Carroll, appearing at the Board, and being Sworn upon the Holy Evangelist, to give true and direct Answers, to such Questions, as shou'd be asked him, His Excellency asked him, if he ever heard or knew of any Rebellion, or disturbance, intended to be made by any Roman Catholicks in this Province, about the Year 1712 or at any time since. The said Mr Carroll answers he never did.

Being asked if ever he made, an Offer of a Tract of Land, in Baltemore County; he says that he did, about three Years

agoe, offer some Land there, as a Charity.
