All the Gentlemen prent are unanimously of opinion that Such an Additionall Duty being so inconsidable not Exceeding one penny p Cent, The Trade cannot be much Affected therewith especially Considering that the Greatest part of the Tobo is Exported by the Inhabitants on their proper Accounts.
