Gentlemen Williamsburgh June the 25th 1726

According to what we had the Honour to write you last p. 154 month by your Messenger we now send you the Copys of three Laws now Subsisting for the Improvement of our Tobacco Trade and shall be glad if any of the Regulations thereby established prove Agreable to the dispositions and Circumstances of the people in your Province

The Bill which in our last we mentioned to be then under Consideration in Assembly was rejected by the House of Burgesses and the chief Reason was because it had a restraint upon the People and Shipping of Virginia while those of your Province were at Liberty to supply the marketts at home at
