Whereas I have received His most Sacred Majestys Instructions bearing Date at the Court of Richmond the 18th Day of June 1728 in the second Year of his Reign thereby declaring his Royal Will and Pleasure that in all the Prayers Litanies and Collects for the Royal Family instead of the Words [His Royal Highness George Prince of Wales the Princess and their Issue and all the Royal Family] there should be inserted [Our Gracious Queen Caroline the Royal Issue and the Rest of the Royal Family] with His Royal Command That his said Will and Pleasure be forthwith published in the several Parish Churches and other Places of Divine Worship within this Province that Obedience be paid thereto accordingly I do therefore by and with the Advice of His Lord-
