Delegates the first day of the Assembly.

Ordered that the several Sheriffs do give publick Notice that the Court of his Excellency the Gov^r & Council for hearing of appeals & writts of Error will sit on the 20th of October next ensuing that his Majestys high Court of Chancery will set upon the 2^d monday in Nov^r next that the prov¹ Court will be held on the 2^d tuesday in the said month of Nov¹ as also the Commissarys Court the same day & that there will be no Prov¹ Court held in the winter till the latter end of April or beginning of May they being found to be very inconvenient by reason of the cold seasons
