Wee propose if your House thinks fitt that for the better preventing the Goale at Annapolis being at any time for the future broke or the Prisoners oversetting the Goaler that a small strong wooden lodge be added to one of the Doors wherein the Goaler may and shall be Obliged to lye every Night and this may be done at a Small Charge not Exceeding six pounds Sterl or ffifteen hundred pounds of Tobacco.

Resolved that the Several Treatys with the Indians be sent to the house for their Perusal & Advice whether they think any thing further necessary to be Added thereto
