And that Your Ex^{ncy} will be pleased to give Sufficient Orders to each Respective Coll that upon any mocon or accon of the Indians those men so raised may presently march ag^t them that no time may be lost this we are of oppinion will Tend much to the Quiett of the Inhabitants & the ffrontier Plantations.
