That Your Petition's having Loaden their Shipps Original are willing and Desirous to Sayle for Europe in Company Journal. of her Matys Shipp Strombulo who your peter are Informed is Designed to Sayle about the Tenth of June next. therefore humbly pray your Ex<sup>ncy</sup> and Hon<sup>rs</sup> Approbation and Leave to Depart this Province with the said Shipp Strombulo and An Order to the Severall Nav" Officers & Collrs to Clear Your Petitioners and their Shipps Accordingly and the Rather that the men under pay on Board the said Shipps are very Desirous to go for Europe and threaten yor Petitioners that if the said Shipps should be Embargo'd here to Shipp themselves on Board the said Ship Strombulo & Leave Yor Petitioners and Travell by Land or otherways to New England which will be very prejudiciall not only to the Owners of the Shipps und Your petis Comand but a Great discouragem to Trade, all Which Your Petitirs humbly pray yor Exncy and Honrs to take into Consideration & Make such Order therein as to your Wisdoms shall seem meet

And your Petitrs shall ever pray &c.

Upon the reading whereof the Petrs are Answered that the p. 411 Gen<sup>ll</sup> Assembly now sitting have Advised his Exncy the Gov not to Suffer any of the Shipping to go with the Strumbulo mann of Warr but to Embargo them untill a Better Convoy Arrives from England And what is ffarr more her Matys Royall Instructions to his Exncy on this Point are so Sacred that he does declare he will not Suffer any of the Shipps to Sayle without a Sufficient Convoy which may Answer that Instrucon

Came Mr Eliaz King Mr Phillips and Mr Hill with the Iournal of the Comittee of Accounts upon Reading whereof it was remarqued that the Comittee have allowed Majr John Freeman for Fire & Candle for the Councill four pounds of which Article this Boarde desired to be better Satisfyed having no Grounds to believe the same any ways Just or Reasonable being sincible no such Charge had ever Occurd since his Exneys arrivall

It is ffurther Remarqd that the Hon: Mr Tench Col. Addison Mr Brooke Mr Cheseldyn and Mr Coursey are not allowed for their Attendance in Councill this or the last Sessions of Assembly neither is there allowed for the Great Seale as usuall for the two Several Prorogations between Septr & December nor any thing for four Copys of the Laws then made or Seals to the new Laws or the tenn pounds his Exney paid for the Apprehending of Benja Celie & fifty two shill paid to George Slacomb to put a Stopp to the Members Coming to the Assembly.
