The third Paragraph in the Report relating to white women Servants that work in the Ground, read and debated. Put to the Question whether white women Servants shall work in the Ground or not?

Carried by Majority of Voices that white women Servants be excused from working in the Ground and ordered a Bill be prepared for that Purpose; and resolved the Bill take Place by X^tmas next.
