Lib. 41.

It being proposed by a Member of this House whether it be not reasonable that Mr W. Bladen the Undertaker of rebuilding the Stadt-House be not advanced and paid some Part of the Consideration on his Contract. It is resolved he be paid out of the publick Stock at assessing the next publick Levy the sum of one hundred Pounds being one half if the Honble Council shall think fit to concur therewith.

Sent up to the Council by Mr Joseph Grey. He returns and says he delivered the Bill.

Col^o William Holland enters the House and delivers Mr Speaker the Bill for apportioning the publick Levy Read and agreed to in Council.

The House adjourns till two o'Clock Afternoon
