We have Examined the fees on Resurveyes as retrenched and it seems to us the Retrenchment is not unreasonable but Sufficient reward proposed to Encourage Art and Industry and we hope your Honours will think so too on reading the same, the Clause is thus Allowed Resurvey of 140 Acres the same Fees as allowed on primitive Surveys and no more the former Law was in that part found Excessive burthensome and this Conceived but moderate and therefore doubt not your Honours Concurrence to the Engrossed Bill which is now ready to be sent up
