

Lib. C. B. distributed amongst the Inhabitants in the following Manner Viz. Ordered that the Ground be marked out and numbered 1. 2. 3 &c Ordered that the Clerk make Tickets & number them on the Inside with the same Numbers as the Places for the Pews both which were done: The Families minded to take Parts of Pews Each Pew being intended to hold three Families (except N^o 4 which being a small Pew was granted to M^r Thomas Grant & M^r Thomas Hillary) joyned themselves together by Threes One of which drew for the Three; the first Lott drawn was N^o 1 which M^r Osborn Sprigg drew for himself M^r Jn^o Cook and M^r Thomas Waring: the second drawn was N^o 7 which fell to M^r Richard Isaac M^r Joseph Peach and M^r William Ducker the next drawn N^o 15 to Major Edward Sprigg M^r Joseph Belt & M^r William Hillary; the next N^o 6 to M^r Robert Wheeler Sen^r M^r Rob^t Wheeler jun^r & M^r Philip Pindle; the next N^o 3 to Captⁿ Jeremiah Belt M^r Thomas Williams and M^r John Hillary; the next N^o 16 to M^r Mareen Duval M^r Lewis Duval & M^r John Duval; the next N^o 8 to M^r George Parker M^r Samuel Farmer and M^r Ninian Maricerte the next N^o 5 to M^r John Child M^r Samuel Tyler & M^r Edward Tyler; the next N^o 13 to M^r Benjamin Hall M^r Rignald Odell & M^{rs} Mary Hall; the next N^o 14 to M^r Benjamin Jacob to M^r Mordecai Jacob and James Beck; the next N^o 11 to M^r Benjamin West M^r Richard Duckett & M^{rs} Eleanor Hillary; the next N^o 2 to M^r William Gee M^r Benjamin Boyd and M^{rs} Deborah Boyd; the next N^o 10 to M^r Richard Symmonds M^{rs} Elizabeth Turnor & M^r Jonⁿ Symmonds the next N^o 12 to D^r William Denune M^r W^m Fowler & M^r Mark Brown; the next N^o 9 to M^r Sam^l Brashears M^r Jn^o Brashears & M^r William Brashears; The People to build the Pews uniform at their own Expence
