p. 796 M<sup>r</sup> James Lloyd and M<sup>r</sup> Daniel Mariartee came from the House of Delegates to acquaint the honble President their House have nothing before them but wait the honble President's Commands

M<sup>r</sup> Young and Col Tilghman sent to require M<sup>r</sup> Speaker and the members of the House of Delegates to attend the Honble President in Council with the Bills agreed on this Session

They return and say they have delivered their Message

And accordingly M<sup>r</sup> Speaker and the Delegates came up and presented to the Honble President in Council the several following Bills Viz

1. A Bill relieving the Inhabitants from some Aggrievances they lye under in prosecution of Suits at Law
2. A Bill reviving the Act for imposing 3<sup>d</sup> p Hhd on Tob<sup>o</sup> towards defraying the Charge of this Province
