Petitions against striking Fish in Dor. and Talbot Counties Read and debated. Put to the Question whether a Bill be brought in to prohibit the striking Fish or not? Resolved in the Affirmative and ordered the Committee of Laws prepare and bring in a Bill accordingly

The House adjourned till to Morrow Morning Nine O'Clock
