This Board having considered the Report from the Conference concerning Appeals and Writs of Error they do agree to the first Part thereof relating to the Courts of Common Law but desire that Part relating to Appeals from the Courts of Chancery may be omitted no Appeals lying from the Court of Chancery here to the Court of Chancery in Great Britain nor any Appeals to her Majesty in Council but where the Thing in Controversy exceeds three hundred Pounds Sterl. Wherefore such Clause will not only be needless but of different Nature to the Title of the Law proposed
