The said Gentlemen we are Satisfyed were at great expences & Trouble on that occasion and could not deny the Commands of the Government then imposed upon them & which were in pursuance to her Majesty's directions to the Governour We desire you will consider the Hardships they lye under, not having dared to deny the execution of those Commissions, and since the Charge of the Provincial Court was considerably lessened thereby; not Suffer private Gentlemen & their Estates to be damnified in the publick Service but make them reasonable Compensation for their Trouble and Expences
